#### Skills Weekend/Black Diamond Mines Hike-a-Thon - May 18 - 20

Jacob Schultz is the scout-in-charge for the actual hike at Black Diamond Mines. Scouts will be doing about 10.6 miles and there is a pull out point at about 6 miles for anyone that has had enough. The hike will take them past all most all of the historical sites that are a part of the Black Diamond Mines Regional Preserve. Rose HIII Cemetery, Jim's Place", Air Shaft, and Stope, to name a few of the sights. Black Diamond in this case stands for Coal which was mined in the late 1860's. It was also used as a sand mine for the glass industry in the 1920's - '40's. This will be the first time our troop has gone out to this area. Scouts going should bring a flashlight as they will be going into Prospect Tunnel, they will also need <u>multiple</u> bottles of water as none is available in the park. Sunscreen will be called for and it can get quite windy out there. It is not usually too hot at that time of year but it can be. Class A for Travel and Class B for the hike and don't forget your hat and sunglasses. Hiking boots are called for, not just tennis shoes. (break them in ahead of time if they are new) Pack a lunch and your 10 essentials in your day bag and you should be ready for a great time.

Those that are not participating in the Skills Weekend can still do the Saturday hike. Just meet up in the upper parking lot at 8:30 am. Allow an hour+ travel time to get there from Castro Valley.

The Hike-a-thon sponsor forms and information packets has been distributed. If you have any questions about the fund raising part of this event, please contact Mr. Pica. If your scout account is running low on funds, this is the time to step up and hike. The Hike-a-thon is designed so that each scout can get out of it, what they put in. #### **Scout Master Minute**

In Boy Scouts we keep track of attendance at Troop Meetings for purposes of Advancement and sometimes to offer awards as carrots for high attendance. We honor attendance at outings during our quarterly Court of Honors. Adult leaders and youth alike realize that scouting is only a part of our lives, that we have family, school, work, sports, music, theater, and other activities that give us full and well rounded lives.

It has been said that 90% of success is just showing up. The addendum to that statement should have been 90% of success is showing up and showing up on time. Our overall Troop Meeting attendance is excellent and trends around 75% – 80% overall. Occasionally a scout will drop below 50% attendance over the course of a few months but that usually picks up when the sport season he is involved with ends. Of greater concern is the perennial tardiness of arrivals at meetings. Troop Meetings start at 7:00 p.m. which means you should arrive by 6:50 p.m. so you can get in the front door, chat with your friends, stop at the rest room, turn in a permission slip and complete other random events. Troop Meetings that are delayed by scouts showing up at exactly 7:00 and trickling in during opening flags and announcements lack a strong sense of cohesiveness.

In life if you show up late there are usually natural well defined penalties such as missing the first inning of the ballgame or being penalized with a tardy slip at school. In scouts there is a penalty to tardiness too but it is nebulous in the form of listless waiting for the event to start or a subtraction from the focus of the meeting.

I would like to set a goal for the Troop to not only continue with the 80% attendance but also make that 80% on time attendance.




